Global Action News...

Well the third rotation of our grade six and grade seven exploratories have come to an end and that means we have just completed another Global Action event! The students in advisory four and ten really wanted to do something to help animals and after much research we identified habitat restoration as the project we wanted to tackle. We started with some work on the school grounds identifying some of the invasive species that were destroying the habitat and we removed a large amount of English Ivy that was choking out some of the native shrubs and trees. The classes also wanted to work on one of the parks in the area and so we arranged to volunteer with Saanich Parks "Pulling Together" program. The two classes spent three hours at Mt Douglas Park working with community volunteers and parks employees to remove the holly and ivy that is taking over much of the native areas. It is one step to help protect these natural areas, but the students truly achieved their goal of "making a difference". Well done!
