Rain Jackets

Safety Drills

Saanich Fire department were here on Tuesday to observe a **Fire Drill**, and Saanich Police were here to take part in our **Lockdown Drill** this morning. Steve Robinson, came to our staff meeting this week to help train staff for the Lockdown Drill. Regular practice helps make staff and students ready for any hazard or emergency. Our **Earthquake Drill** takes place on October 19th during the *Great BC ShakeOut*, happening province-wide that day. We appreciate the strong support of our PAC in purchasing and helping organize our earthquake supplies, which we continue to add to every year. You can do your part at home by making sure your smoke alarms are tested regularly and functioning, and by having emergency supplies on hand for an earthquake or other event as well.

Grade 7 FSA testing

The province has moved these annual tests to October from February in an effort to get the results to schools in a more timely manner. They have started this week, and we appreciate parents support in having students take part. I very much value the evidence that this assessment provides us. Combined with other sources of data, it is used at AGMS to determine where we need to focus our efforts for improved student learning.

PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent/Teacher Conferences will take place October 25th and 26th.

This year we will once again be using an online booking system to sign up for our parent-teacher conferences. The website is <u>http://arbutusglobal.schoolappointments.com/</u>. The website will walk you through the registration and booking process. **All families will need to create an account since the accounts from last year have been deleted for security purposes.** Once bookings are made the times will then be confirmed with an email home. Bookings can be made/changed online using this system from Friday, October 13 until Monday, October 23 at <u>8am</u>. After this time period, parents will need to contact their child's advisory teacher directly to make any changes or to create new appointments.

Parents are asked to choose a time to meet with their child's advisory teacher as this is the person that oversees your child's academic program. If your child is working with our resource teachers then you can set up an appointment with them as well. If you have questions for your child's other teachers then please talk to your child's advisory teacher and they can set up another meeting or find out the answer to your questions.



Exploratory Classes

Exploratory classes are limited to 21 students in all grades this year due to restored contract language. This has had a positive effect in these classes, and teachers are enjoying being able to provide more time per student. We have eight different Exploratory courses at AGMS available over the 3 years: Art, Drama, Home Economics, Global Action, Music, Technology Education, Outdoor Education and Coding.


Nov. 14 Earthquake
