Organizational Skills - We all know the importance of organizational skills both in our professional work, as well as in keeping family schedules flowing smoothly each week. Additionally, these skills are critically important for success in student learning. Our staff is working hard this year to ensure that each student has a **"trusted system"** to organize their learning materials and stay on top of pending assignments. Students can choose from a wide array of systems ranging from traditional agendas and planners, to the latest on-line apps, or a combination of both. This trend to move to direct instruction with respect to these skills is proving to be very effective. Please discuss with your child what trusted system they use to stay organized. They may even have a hot tip for you to use!

Social Emotional Learning - The work to improve the social-emotional well-being of our students continues at AGMS. Staff are using a number of resources from the *Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning* (CASEL) to promote learning in this area. Personal and Social Development is one of the core competencies in the BC curriculum, and dovetails nicely with this school goal area.

Attendance - One of the biggest determinants of school success is regular attendance and getting to school on time. Missing 2 days per month, results in approximately a 10% absence rate, and can have a dramatically negative impact on the chances for a student to successfully graduate. Our staff is continuing to work hard to address student attendance issues by engaging with students at risk and their families. Please do everything you can to have your child arriving at school on time and attending regularly to reap the benefits available at school each day. It can truly alter the success your child will experience in life.
