# **SummerBand**

**Switch Band**

Ages: 11–18 Location: Middle School Band Room

This two-week program is designed for students with at least one year of band experience who would like to try switching to a new instrument. The first week will be spent in small groups with teachers specializing in their 'new' selected instrument. After the first few lessons, students will form a band on their new instruments and perform a concert at the end of the session. The ability to read music is a necessity.

# **Big Band Jazz**

**Dates**: July 9–13 **Time**: 10:30 am–12:00 pm **Ages**: 11–18 **Location**: Schaffter Building

The Jazz Band workshop is for students who would like to experience jazz in Big Band. This workshop not only provides excellent instruction in a positive and fun environment, it is also an excellent opportunity for young rising stars to meet and develop their skills in a traditional big band setting. In addition to daily rehearsals, there are also master classes and improvisation sessions. The music will be energized with swing, latin, and rhythm and blues, and is open to saxophone, trumpet, trombone, piano, guitar, bass, vocalists, and drums students. Clarinet or flute players can also be accommodated through special arrangement. Subject to enrollment, there will be both intermediate and advanced ensembles.

### Senior Jazz Intensive & Jazz Combos \$200

**Dates**: July 9–13 **Time**: 1:00–3:30 pm **Cost Ages**: 12–18 **Location**: Schaffter Building

Groups of 4-8 players work in small ensembles under the direction of a single teacher. All levels are welcome and groups will be organized so that students work with others at a similar level. The teachers may also perform with the students.

The Jazz Combos will focus on improvisation, rhythm and small group arrangements. The instrumentation will be rhythm section (piano, guitar, bass & drums) plus lead instruments consisting of almost anything else, including voice. All the combos will explore a wide variety of musical styles.

# **String Orchestra**

The String Orchestra is for students who want to experience playing in a full string ensemble. The workshop provides an engaging atmosphere for students of all levels and is a fantastic place for students to develop their musical and technical skills.

Included with the String Orchestra in Week 1 are daily masterclasses on your own instrument, where students have a chance work with professionals on their own string instrument in a positive and fun environment. Open to violin, viola, cello, and bass students.

# **Chamber Ensembles**

Groups of 4-8 players will work in small ensembles under the direction of a single teacher. All levels are welcome and groups will be organized so that students work with others at a similar level.

The Chamber Ensembles will focus on learning to play in small groups, with an emphasis on different string techniques, musicianship and experiencing a variety of different music genres. Instrumentation will largely be string quartets and quintets, with a mix of violins, violas, cellos and bass.

Learn to sing and act in this exciting credit course. Instruction is aimed at enhancing performance skills and learning about the development of a full-length musical. Students will be taken through the audition and casting process, assigned roles, and then focus on vocals, microphone use, character development, stage presence and movement. The final outcome is a series of showcase performances as part of the Victoria Fringe Festival.

#### Synopsis

The final production will be four full-length performances of *Disaster!*, a recent Broadway hit show and a parody of the 1970s disaster film genre. In this musical, a group of New Yorkers attend a grand opening of a floating casino (and even a disco!) that quickly succumbs to all sorts of tragic disasters. Inspired by plots from instantly recognizable 1970s disaster films, this hilarious show features classic disasters ranging from earthquakes to killer bee invasions. This "jukebox musical" revives popular 70s songs that will feature the entire cast. Characters include a nun with a gambling addiction, a lounge singer and a flirtatious casino caterer! Students will play at least one role, maybe more!
