Recharge, Perform and Smile Nov. 20

As part of our efforts to increase social-emotional well-being, students are invited to come hear a lunchtime talk next Tuesday in the cafeteria by Zoran Stjokovic from Kizo Performance who is a mental performance consultant who works with local athletes. His talk will focus on how students can take care of their "battery" and keep it fully charged every day when involved in an active and busy lifestyle. This talk is not just for athletes but for any student facing the challenge of balancing school responsibilities, pastimes and family life.





Key Areas of Concern in Arbutus Neighbourhood

The attached Active and Safe Routes to School survey found the following areas mentioned as areas of concern:

- Dawnview and Edgelow St. no crosswalk, congestion, no sidewalk on southside of Edgelow
- Edgelow St. and Finnerty Rd. busy intersection, two crosswalks (upgrades coming soon to this area)
- Feltham Rd. and Gordon Head Rd. busy intersection, blind spot with left turn lane and cars not stopping

Additionally, after the walkabout this morning these other areas were also mentioned:

- Edgelow and Gordon Head Rd. cars conflicting with pedestrians when light turns red, cars turn left onto Gordon Head Road from Edgelow on red light are rushed, very congested for part-time light, pedestrians not waiting for light to turn red
- Lexington and head of walkway/cut-through path to back door of school very congested , used as drop-off and pick up time, students coming out of trail on bikes or walking into busy traffic, no signage on road regarding school, traffic calming needed
