Boys Field Hockey

Boys field Hockey has been run by Jeremy Ross of GHMS, for the past three years, and they are looking for more boys to register.

The league will run from April 9-May 14 at the UVic field hockey turf next to CARSA. Matches will each Wednesday from 3:45-5:15. Players will be drafted onto balanced teams on a weekly basis and will play a Hockey 5's format for the league.
