Human Library and the 2020 Curiosity Quest

For the second year now, our Teacher-Librarian, Mrs. Popovic is organizing a Human Library for students. This event takes place on **Jan. 29** and features parents, and local community members with interesting and specialty backgrounds and stories, coming to Arbutus to act as human books, and share their stories with groups of students. Students prepare questions ahead time, and the event is meant to set the stage for our third annual inquiry-based learning project starting the week after on Feb. 5. This 8 week project will take place every Wednesday. We are calling it *Curiosity Quest* this year and the aim is to have every Arbutus student identify a passion and go through an inquiry-based learning process by researching an "essential question" about their topic. The idea is to deepen their thinking and help all students understand the power and benefits of being curious in their learning.
