Pink Shirt Day: Staff and students highlighted the need for anti-bullying efforts in our communities by wearing pink on Wednesday. This annual event is meant to spur discussion on the dangers of bullying and encourage students to know what to do if it occurs. This is an on-going process throughout the year in classrooms and across the school, but this event draws extra attention to the significance of this issue every February.

Black History Month: We started February with a school assembly to mark the beginning of Black History Month. Teachers have been using various resources to celebrate and teach about black history in Canada. Not unlike Pink Shirt Day however, these efforts should not be just limited to the month of February.



Moreover in terms of promoting diversity, we recently started an Anti-Racism Leadership Group for interested students that meets weekly at lunchtime to plan school projects to combat racism. We are committed to maintaining a safe and caring school environment where racism is not tolerated. This takes a team effort with staff continually reinforcing with students the importance of taking action if you witness or hear something inappropriate. This could mean alerting a staff member or speaking up, depending on the situation. It also involves having firm consequences for children who make serious mistakes involving racist comments or behaviours. I know we all agree that there can no room for such behaviour in our school community. The message that we celebrate diversity and value and honour differences in others is part of



our global theme. We must make sure we bring those words to life by acting when we see injustice.
