This year our registration process will be online. Important dates are as follows:

- Grade 8's program of choice for grade 9—Deadline for registration is Jan. 22.
- Late French Registration for incoming grade 6's—registration is January 25-29. Registration forms will be available closer to registration week and will be online. Registration is a lottery system. Deadline is Jan. 29. Forms will not be accepted before Jan. 25.

Parents will be notified the following week regarding placement.

~ Transfer week— Feb 8-11—primarily grade 8's wishing to go to a different high school than their catchment. Also for students who want to change programs—moving from French to English. Also for students in any grade who are wanting to change schools the coming year.

Forms will be available on our District and school websites and in the office for students to pick up closer to transfer week. Forms will not be accepted before Feb. 8.
