Please use the new and recently revised **Daily Health Check** form each morning—found at https://www.sd61.bc.ca/covid-19/ to ensure your child is healthy and not exhibiting any respiratory symptoms. Parents must also check with a medical professional or call 811 to ensure their child does not have COVID 19 before they can return to school.
