It was with very heavy hearts that we began the week after learning of the tragic discovery at the Kamloops Residential School on the lands of the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation last week. We have reached out to all students and staff to ensure they know there are supports available at the school to support them during this very difficult time. This is particularly true for indigenous students and families, who we know are deeply impacted by this news. Staff gathered at the end of day on Monday (right) to drum the Residential School song to honour the 215 children lost in this tragedy. This grim reminder of a terrible time in Canadian history can hopefully help all of us



redouble our efforts to achieve true reconciliation, and implement all 94 recommendations from the Justice Murray Sinclair in the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

### **Covid Protocol if Your Child is Unwell**

Please use the new and recently revised *Daily Health Check* form each morning—found at <a href="https://www.sd61.bc.ca/covid-19">https://www.sd61.bc.ca/covid-19</a>/ to ensure your child is healthy and not exhibiting any respiratory symptoms. If any students or staff are sick <a href="mailto:they must not come to school">they must not come to school</a>. This will be essential in keeping our school community safe this spring. Parents must also check with a medical professional or call 811 to ensure their child does not have COVID 19 before they can return to school.
