

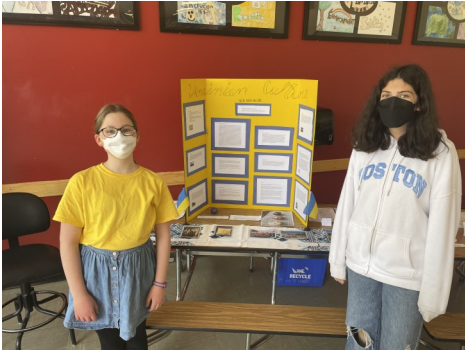
# The Arbutus Global Week at a Glance...
