

THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

It has been a wonderful beginning to my second year as principal at Arbutus Global. The sun shone all week, students have settled in beautifully, and we had another fun week with Grade Games on Wednesday (Grade 6s won! Woot, woot!) and Beach Day today. (see photos!).

Last May, our staff began conversations around how we could "Start Strong" in September, including finding ways to strengthen student and staff feelings of connection and belonging at Arbutus Global by putting "relationships before learning". This in part came from the recognition that these past three years of school have been very



challenging and different for students (and staff!), and we could all use some grounding around what is most important to ensure we have an inclusive, kind, respectful and safe school culture. We want to make sure every student feels seen, safe and supported in their identities, uniqueness, and gifts, and develop those while here for their three years.

We have created a system we are now referring to as "Starting and Staying Strong at Arbutus Global", which includes common messaging, values, lessons, strategies, routines, and procedures that will be taught across the school. This is one way we are ensuring our school goals around Social-Emotional Learning and Culturally-Responsive Teaching are part of our every day.

Two resources we are using to help with this are the First Peoples Principles of Learning and the Circle of Courage. The Circle of Courage highlights specific ways adults can nurture self-worth in children in the areas of BELONGING (having healthy connections and attachments at school), MASTERY (embracing learning new things and knowing they can and will achieve to the best of their abilities and overcome challenges), INDEPENDENCE (building resilience and the abilities to be responsible and manage challenges on their own) and GENEROSITY (developing a sense of purpose in the world and helping and supporting others). We recognize that we need to give children OPPORTUNITIES, EXPERIENCES and ENVIRON-MENTS to learn, develop, and exercise these characteristics. All students need scaffolding and support to reach their full potential, and we will do our best to provide that.

We hope your knowing about "Starting and Staying Strong" will help you understand some of the things your child may come home and talk about, or why we may have approached supporting them with challenges in a particular way.

As you know, we moved into permanent classes yesterday. With 420 students, it is challenging to get every placement perfect. Disappointments usually fade within a short time once students settle and make new connections with staff and fellow students. We appreciate the understanding and adaptability that students and parents have shown in respecting the complexities that go into creating balanced classes for optimum learning.

On Monday, Exploratory Classes will begin, and on Friday we have Photo Day and our Mock Earthquake / Reunification Drill. *Please see the additional info in this WAG for volunteers to help us with our drill on Friday*.

Thank you for supporting your children in having such a successful first week. We appreciate it!


Hot Lunch Program

Please **do not** email the general Arbutus email as that is not always monitored in the morning which will result in you getting an absence call-out.








MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT
