THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Welcome to May! Apparently, we are going to need to be more patient for some consistently sunny weather, but we have been grateful for our time in the sun earlier this week.

Mrs. Walt and I had the pleasure of visiting Frank Hobbs and Campus View on Tuesday to meet with grade 5 teachers for transition meetings. We are very excited about all of the students who will be joining us next year! Grade 8 teachers are meeting with high schools over the next two weeks to pass on important information to high schools.

Today is Red Dress Day — also known as the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and Two-Spirit People. The day honours and brings awareness to the thousands of Indigenous women, girls and two-spirit people who have been subject to disproportionate violence in Canada. Red Dress Day was inspired by Métis artist Jaime Black's REDress Project installation, in which she hung empty, red dresses to represent the missing and murdered women. Individual teachers chose how to acknowledge the day in different ways, and Ms Weckend and I joined Mrs. Hill in Mr. Stephen's grade 8 class, where we engaged in drumming several songs. It was explained to students that the reality of how Indigenous women and girls are viewed and treated in our society is part of our current history, and that it is our responsibility to learn and do better. Honoring and celebrating Indigenous culture is one way that we can shift that view to one of respect and valuing. Students learned today about circle protocols, Indigenous medicines, and drummed and sang several songs for which SD61 has permission to perform.




Athletics this week at Arbutus brought playoff badminton over three days. Our team did extremely well with many athletes qualifying for the semifinals happening Monday May 8th.
